Olga Kreiter started her piano studies at Viimsi Music School with Marju Mägi. She continued her studies with Piret Väinmaa at the Georg Ots Music School in Tallinn. Since 2017, she has been studying at the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre with Sten Lassmann. In 2021, she obtained her Bachelor's degree at the Frankfurt University of Music and Performing Arts, where she studied with Professor Axel Gremmelpacher.

Kreiter has performed with many renowned pianists, including Eugen Indjic, Aleksandra Žvirblyté, Andrey Ivanov, Mira Marchenko, Hando Nahkur, Lauri Väinmaa, Viatcheslav Novikov. Kreiter has taken part in international festivals and competitions in Estonia, Germany, Austria and Lithuania, where she performed as a soloist as well as a chamber musician. In 2021 she won First Prize at the International Competition-Festival "Music without Limits" in two categories – as a soloist and a member of a Lied-duo. Olga has performed with Georg Ots Music School Symphony Orchestra at the Estonia Concert Hall as well as with the Baroque Ensemble of the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre. In addition to the piano, she also plays the fortepiano.
