Edwin Sz wajkowski is the recipient of several awards including First Prize at the International Chopin Piano Competition in Mariánské Lázně (2019), distinction at the 8th International Čiurlionis Piano Competition in Vilnius (2019) and Third Prize at the 17th International Piano Competition MozARTE in Aachen (2021).

He has performed throughout Europe and Asia. As a soloist Edwin has performed with philharmonic orchestras in Tallinn, Kielce, St. Petersburg and Moscow, the Polish Radio Symphony Orchestra, the Chopin University Symphonic Orchestra, the West Bohemian Symphony Orchestra, the Lithuanian National Symphony Orchestra and Sinfonietta Köln. Sz wajkowski has performed at the 69th and 70th International Chopin Festival in Duszniki-Zdrój, the International Čiurlionis Festival in Lithuania, and the 62nd Chopin Festival in Mariánské Lázně. Currently he is a student of the music performance excellence program at the Robert Schumann Hochschule in Düsseldorf under the tutelage of Professor Paolo Giacometti.
